

A LETTER FROM OUR DIRECTOR

Dear Community,

Continuing to grow and expand our team, our base, and our community of empowered AANHPI's in Arizona this year has truly been a dream come true for me - a dream that was seeded when I was a kid growing up in California. Many of my Asian peers and I struggled with internalized racism, often uncomfortable and ashamed of our backgrounds; I never had a safe space or a political home to learn about Asian American history, nor to feel comfortable enough to share what I was going through with youth like me. Now, seeing our Youth Program and the civic engagement work we have built over the past five years moves me; at Arizona AANHPI for Equity, we have built the very community centered on AANHPI identity that I wish I would have had as a young person!

From launching our first Youth Climate Camp to building our We Imagine Safety program, working to improve the lives of unhoused folks in our community and to reimagine what public safety looks like through education and advocacy, our team has accomplished so much this year. One of my proudest achievements is on-boarding two new full-time team members, Amritha and Carla, who were both fellows in our first inaugural Youth Fellowship program in 2019. This is the leadership pipeline! To see our AANHPI youth become politicized and empowered through this work, come intern with our team, and then decide to stay in Arizona or move back here after college in order to engage and advocate for our communities, now becoming full-time staff, has been humbling.

I founded AZ AANHPI for Equity to fill a critical gap in the civic engagement infrastructure in Arizona. Today we remain the leading AANHPI organization in our state that actively engages in advocacy work. Since our founding we have contributed to increasing the voter turnout rate of AANHPI's in our state from 42% to 75% in the 2024 election cycle. We do this by intentionally reaching out to every AANHPI in

the state with in-language materials; educating our community on crucial issues (and not just during election years); and by building a political home for our youth where they are empowered to find their voices among leaders who look like them.

I am eternally grateful to our community, our team, and our funders who have made this work possible. Without you, the interest of Arizona AANHPI's would not be represented in the political sphere. In 2025 we know we will be taking on advocacy defense work; we know that our communities will not be safe under the next administration. But because of the community we have built over the past five years, we also know that our community is ready - we are educated, empowered, and mobilized to fight for our rights and to protect each other.

CIVIC ENGAGEMENT



OUT MISSION The Civic Engagement program strives to better represent AANHPIs, BIPOC, and other marginalized communities in policy changes. We do this by conducting voter registration, educating voters on issues and policies, and mobilizing voters to the polls. In 2024, we focused on increasing voter turnout in a historically low voter turnout city that is home to one of Arizona's largest universities. We also continued our mission to maintain high AANHPI voter turnout statewide.

We are proud to contribute to expanding a voter block with our voter registration program. Along with the AZ AANHPI We Imagine Safety program, we advocated for restorative justice, which includes ending felony voter disenfranchisement. In 2024, we partnered with Free Our Vote and AZ Justice Protect in a mailer program to get newly eligible people to register to vote.

In 2024, we were able to establish two advocacy campaigns as part of our voter education efforts. We Imagine Safety shifts the narrative on criminalization and community resilience. The Climate Justice program educates voters on climate policies and ballot impacts on climate change. Considering that 40% of AZ AANHPIs do not affiliate with a political party, voter education is crucial during an election cycle.





CLIMATE JUSTICE

Our Mission The Climate Justice Program aims to educate our community on the many intersectionalities between our climate crisis and racial justice. We envision building community through strengthening environmental action in Arizona while amplifying AANHPI, BIPOC, and other marginalized voices to fight our climate crisis! The Climate Justice Program is an educational and reflective space, where we appreciate and care for nature and mother earth as we care for ourselves. We promote solidarity with all communities and understand the human actions that are causing climate injustices at home and around the world. We use education to understand and equip us to be civically involved at our local and state level.

Awarded the Environmental Protection and Justice Award

Sunday, November 17th, AZ AANHPI for Equity was awarded an Environmental Justice award from one of our partnered organizations, the Sierra Club Grand Canyon! Organizations and volunteers came together in a picnic style award event to highlight community and environmental solitary. As we move into these upcoming federal, state, and local administrative changes, it is vital that we stand strong in unity and together stand up for our environment.





The Earth Day Festival:

April 20th, AZ AANHPI for Equity partnered with Chispa AZ, to celebrate Mamma Earth by elevating the fight for environmental justice in a vibrant and safe space for our community to gather, eat, learn, and have fun. We invited partners from all over Arizona to join in solidarity, celebrate, and connect with the community.

Youth Climate Connection Camp:

March 15-17th, AZ AANHPI launched our first annual Youth Climate Connection Camp for elementary to university age youth. High school and university-age youths exercised their leadership, public speaking, and critical thinking skills. The elementary and middle school program introduced climate crisis basics, while connecting with nature through art and our ancestral power to learn how to heal through our mother earth at an early age.

Climate Advocacy Wins

- Reached over **400** people through events, monthly environmental justice workshops, town halls, c3 lobbying efforts, Environmental Day at the capitol, press conferences, & coalition expansion
- Toured **Gila River** solar panel setup and began expanding our relationship building with Indigenous communities
- Received our first ever environmental justice award in November by Sierra Club
- Had our first elementary age youth tabling volunteer at the Climate Festival

- developed from a youth camper to our first **AANHPI Youth Climate Ambassador**!
- Hired our first Climate ResilienceOrganizer
- Obtained 6 new climate volunteers and launched our first climate volunteer orientation
- Made climate & environmental attorney connections
- Testified between the ACC and State
 Capitol against over 6 bills/proposals

WE IMAGINE SAFETY

OUT MISSION The We Imagine Safety (WIS) program harnesses the visionary, healing power of our community to transform the way Arizonans define justice. We believe in the power of collective solidarity to reimagine and rebuild a public safety model rooted in community wellbeing. We aim to fuel policy change across Arizona, including in the areas of criminal justice, immigration, community development, and equity, and to organize mutual aid efforts to enhance community wellbeing.



WIS Legal Clinic: Our Work in 2024

We Imagine Safety Legal Clinic is a stronghold of liberation and inclusivity, committed to dismantling systems of oppression through legal advocacy. The clinic's mission is rooted in empowering the community through legal education, broadening access to justice, and nurturing the next generation of liberators.

We deliver comprehensive support, including direct intervention, educational empowerment, and collective action efforts to carve pathways toward true democratic liberation. Our team is a collective run by people who have navigated and survived the very systems we fight against.

The legal clinic has been actively fostering relationships with 69 organizations. We have successfully partnered with the eastside and westside probation offices to provide informative sessions about our services. To date, we have conducted six workshops for community service providers, equipping their staff with accurate information on the Restoration of Rights and Know your Rights. Additionally, we have teamed up with Arizona Faith Network to offer monthly workshops and legal services.

We received 200 calls to our legal clinic:

- 15 child support cases
- 5 divorces
- **75** fingerprint clearance applications
- **50** DACA applications

- 12 Temporary Protected Status applications
- **2** Violence Against Women Act Protections
- **1** U-Visa
- 90 Rights Restoration applications

Among these 90 cases:

55 individuals are still on probation and owe fees, qualifying for additional services such as set-asides and marijuana expungements.

We are currently assisting **35** people with **restoring their rights** and other related services.
